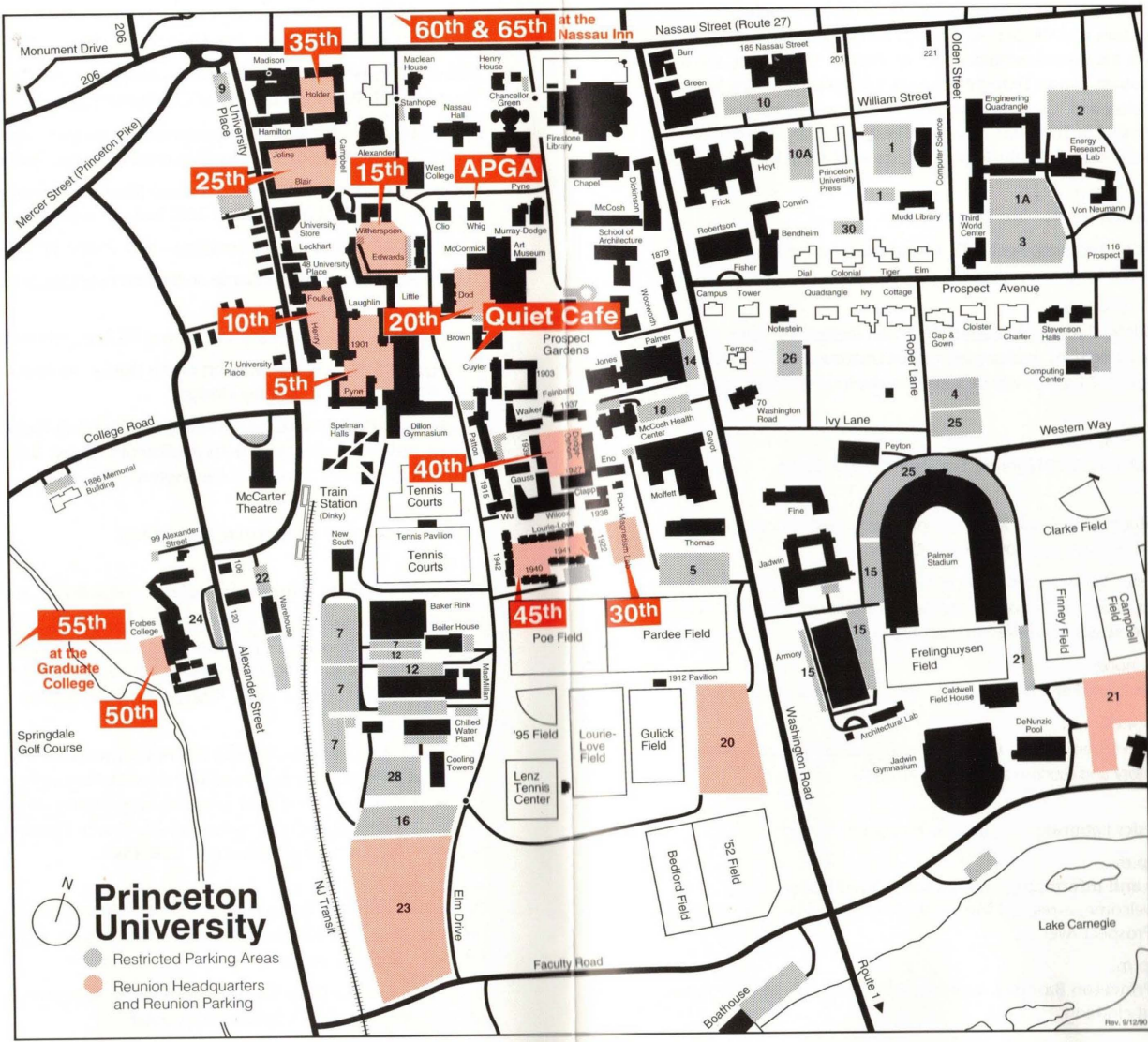

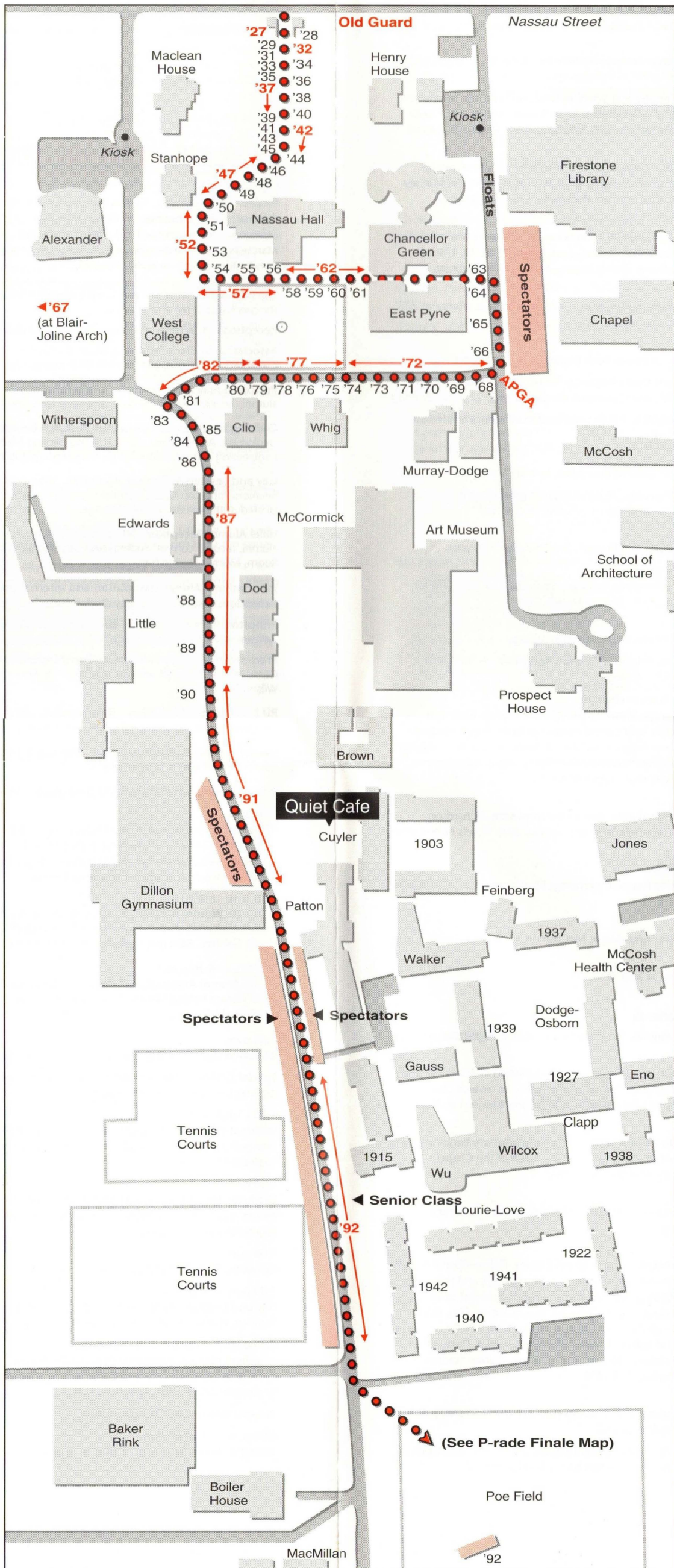

Policy on Alcohol

Members of the University community are reminded that New Jersey State law prohibits consumption of alcohol by anyone under the age of 21. It is University policy to strictly enforce this and other policies pertaining to alcohol, which prohibit:

1. carrying open containers of alcohol in public spaces by anyone regardless of age, including carrying and consumption of alcohol in the P-rade.
2. serving more than two containers of beer to one individual at one time.
3. serving alcohol to anyone not wearing an authorized Reunion badge with a 1992 stamp signifying he or she is 21 years or older.
4. operation of bars and kegs after 2 a.m. and during the P-rade, 2 to 4:30 p.m. on Saturday.

This year, for the first time, several major classes will require additional identification of those wishing to be served alcohol:

Fifth Reunion - a wristband

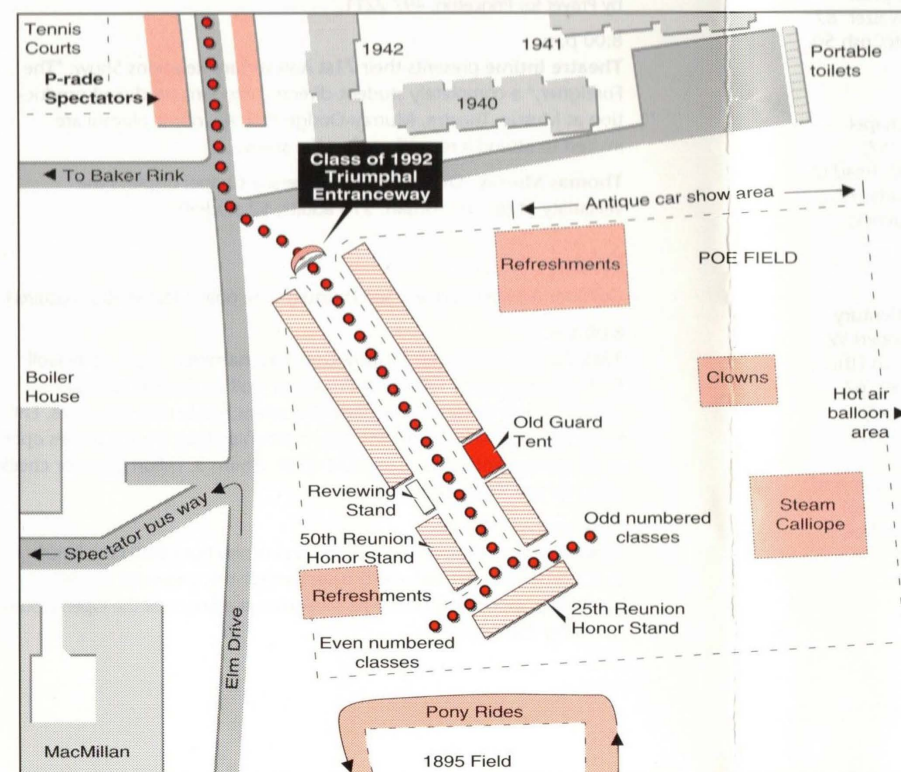
Tenth - a wristband
